May YOU shine the light of Christ in the New Year

Starting a New Year is a great opportunity to ask ourselves if there are changes we need to make in our walk with the Lord. A.W. Tozer said, "We are as close to God right now, as we want to be." The apostle Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 13:5a, "Examine yourself as to whether you are in the faith."

It's a good thing to stop every once in a while and take a personal inventory. "Am I where I want to be with God?" "Have I reached my potential in Him?" "Have I discovered my divine destiny?" "How can I glorify Him more in this coming year?" Here are four possible New Year's Resolutions we can consider to help us in our mortal journey.

Prayer: Leonard Ravenhill once said, "A man is no greater than his personal prayer life." Our prayer life needs to begin with us. Our entire spiritual walk flows from our personal prayer life.
