It's so good to be back in Glendive after a very busy June and July 2019. And, we have a couple of busy and productive and faith filled months ahead of us.

Glendive UMC will hold a special called Church Conference on August 18, right after worship and a potluck. The sole topic up for vote by professing members (everyone is invited) is whether to change the manner of church governance from multiple small committees to a Single Board Model. District Superintendent Rev. Deborah Christine will lead this short meeting.

Why this change to your local church governance? On June 3, 2019, at the Administrative Board meeting, the Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development presented a proposed Single Board structure to the Board. The justifications for this change are available in my office. By consensus, the Board approved that the Single Board plan go forward for Church Conference concurrence. The 2016 Book of Discipline requires a Church Conference to approve this change.

Ideally, the new Board will be composed of two representatives from each of the functional areas of church business: finance, trustees, SPRC, leadership development, and a representative from worship (Pastor) ,and faith development, Lay Leader, Lay Member to Annual Conference, Secretary and youth/young adult (12-35), Nominating Committee and Pastor.

If the decision of the Board is affirmed at the Church Conference, it will become effective January 2020. This fall, the Nominations Committee will seek leaders based on the new structure. If you have any questions, please contact Marlene Lindquist or Joan Haugeberg.

If you would like to serve on the Board, please let us know. Many hands make light work, as it's said.
