December?

December gets its name from the Latin word *decem* (meaning ten) because it was originally the tenth month of the year in the Roman calendar.

January?

January (in Latin, Januarius) is named after Janus, the god of beginnings and transitions; the name has its beginnings in Roman mythology, coming from the Latin word for door (ianua) since January is the door to the year.

New Year

Traditionally, the original Roman calendar consisted of 10 months totaling 304 days, winter being considered a monthless period. Around 713 BC, the semimythical successor of Romulus, King Numa Pompilius, is supposed to have added the months of January and February, allowing the calendar to equal a standard lunar year (354 days).

The dinner is a lot of work and it takes many hands to get it done!! Many thanks to all those who were willing to come early and stay late to help.




