There are now containers downstairs at the church marked for cardboard and recyclable plastics. If you have a few items, you can bring them with you to church and they will be picked up by GROW. We hope this will make it easier for some of our members to participate.

Accepted:

<u>Corrugated cardboard</u>: all boxes flattened, no oil, grease or paint.

<u>#1 and #2 plastic bottles:</u> usually with a symbol and number on the

bottom. (Please rinse and let dry)

#1 are clear, screw-top (discard the lid), have a dimple on the bottom.

Examples -water, juice, Power-aid, soda, hand soap, coffee creamer, syrup

#2 are translucent (a finger inserted in the container can be seen through the plastic), have a screw-top, have a seam across the bottom. Example - milk

### **All-Church Dinner Report**

Our annual roast beef dinner on November 17 was a success!

Planning the dinner as take-out was very different from our usual sit-down dinner. The emphasis on early pre-paid orders worked so well that we cut off orders on the Sunday before the dinner because we had only purchased 200 take-out containers. We had orders for 194 dinners – 177 adult and 17 child (age 12 and under).

In addition to the ticket sales, income included:

additions to the ticket price

extra donations to cover the cost of dinner ingredients/supplies

sale of leftover meat, potatoes, gravy and pie after the dinner

donations at Sunday's coffee hour fellowship time when we served the leftover pie Our income total was around \$3,000 and expenses were about \$900, so we should have cleared about \$2,100.

As always, the church dinner is about more than making money. It's the ALL-CHURCH Dinner because it takes all of the church to make it happen. After many months of social distancing and limiting our gatherings, this dinner brought us together. It took many people planning, taking orders, cleaning, chopping cabbage and carrots, cooking and slicing the meat, peeling and mashing potatoes, making the (yummy!) gravy, baking and cutting pies, serving the dinners into containers, filling orders and washing dishes. And we had fun doing it!

Special thanks to Greg and Joan Hunt for the office help. The spreadsheet they made was very helpful in the planning and the pie container labels were a nice touch.

We have heard many very nice comments about the dinner. Will we do it again as a take-out? We don't know that. But if you have suggestions for something that could be done differently to improve it in that format, write it down & give or email it to Andrine.
