CLEANING OUT THE CLOSETS: A CHURCH RUMMAGE SALE IS COMING


Are you, like me, already thinking about a New Year's resolution to clean out some closets? The church has a suggestion for you!

Glendive United Methodist Church Trustee's Report for 2015.

Parsonage Roof Replacement

The parsonage roof was damaged by hail in July of 2013. A claim was made to our insurance company, Church Mutual, and approved. Due to a lack of contractors an extension was granted until 2015. Mark Anderson Roofing was hired to reshingle the parsonage in the spring of 2015. This project was finished in June and cost \$8,200.

The insurance payment was \$9,140 which paid for all the work.

Bell Tower Roof

The lower roof by the bell and the top tower roof needed to be completely replaced.

The wooden joists also needed to be replaced. These are the original roofs from over 110 years ago. This summer Mark Anderson Roofing of Glendive rebuilt and repaired both roofs. Two new metal weather tight access hatchways were also installed. The cost of the 2 new bell tower roofs was \$10,000.

New Lights in Classroom

Thanks to Robin Thompson Electric for installation of the new lights in classrooms and repairing the fan controls. They were needed, are easier to maintain and a nice improvement.

Thanks to the Hunts, Milnes for the lawn service, and many others for their work to help maintain the church throughout the year.

Church Insurance Review

In 2015 a review of the church's insurance was done to meet the new minimum requirements of the conference. Changes made to our Church Mutual policy were to extend the blanket limit coverage of the church, parsonage and all inside property of both to a new limit of \$2,274,000. All coverage was increased to Package 1 extensions. They include sexual misconduct liability to \$500,000, legal defense to \$10,000, theft of money/securities to \$5,000, employment practices to \$10,000. Out total premium will is \$5,682 for 3 years which was an increase from \$4,796 per year. Out church mutual insurance is handled through HUB Insurance.

Also contacted was United Methodist Insurance for a bid on our entire church to meet the new requirements. After a lot of research, this new company they came up with a yearly premium of \$5,798 for a total package of \$4 million. Both policies have deductible of \$1,000. The decision was made to stay with Church Mutual Insurance.

Tree Trimming Completed

The 2 large elm trees on Kendrick Avenue, the parsonage hedge and the front lilacs were all trimmed this spring by A&D Tree services at a cost of \$850.

Glendive United Methodist Church Foundation.

The Trustees manage the funds of the Church Foundation which is invested by ED Jones.

The fund currently has a value of approximately \$65,000. Since 1993 this fund has generated \$60,000 in earnings. The original principal of this fund was \$51,500 and the church can vote to use any funds above the principal amount at the Annual Charge Conference. In the past income from this fund has been used for education, handicapped access (the elevator) and conference claims (mission shares).

It would good to increase the value of the Foundation to \$100,000 so the church would have a solid financial fund to depend on for needed projects that seem to come up all the time.


