Pastorz Corner

As I write this, it dawned on me I have been serving here in Glendive and Wibaux for about six months. It's an odd amount of time to get your mind around: 6-months. Not long enough to grow a baby. Too long to be on vacation. Not long enough to become fluent in a new language. And, way too long for house guests!

All new pastors are led to new congregational growth, renewal and bringing forth new life in the family of God. And, even though I am experiencing new things every day; new adventures and meeting new people, I am not really on vacation. However, because one of my gifts is languages, I feel like I am making progress on learning the language and culture of my new churches and their communities. But I am not fluent yet. I like the idea of United Methodist ministers staying in church appointments for three to five years. So, I haven't reached the 'stayed too long' state yet. (I'm sure someone will let me know when I have.)

My six months stay so-far has taught me the following about the folks here in Glendive, Montana: they are pretty much like people everywhere, in every culture and every village and town. Hoping for a better life for their kids and their community. Steeped in traditions longer than the present generation, they are also open to changes that may provide that better future. Seeking a deeper understanding of God's plan for them while also trying to get through what can be a very difficult human world to navigate. They have welcomed this stranger in a strange land given me the opportunity to be part of the community, warts and all.

As we celebrate Black History Month, it's appropriate to read again the words of Harriet Tubman, "I have crossed de line of which I had so long been dreaming. I was free: but dere was no one to welcome me to de land of freedom, I was a stranger in a strange land."

My hope and prayer is that no one ever experiences being a stranger in a strange land, even if you have lived in Glendive all your life!

History and Polity

So, you signed up to be a trustee at Glendive UMC. What a great title, Trustee! You can just visualize your name listed on church letterhead. Maybe you'll get a business card too? Uh, not so fast.

As a trustee, you will supervise and maintain all property belonging to the congregation. * Why do this? So that the ministries of the congregation can be effective. So, we can make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

The basic responsibilities of trustees are:

- Make an annual report to the charge conference on the state of church proper, equipment, investments and resources. *
- Receive and administer all gifts made to the congregation and ensure all trust funds are invested properly.
- In conjunction with the pastor, be responsible for all uses of church buildings and grounds.
- Ensure all articles of incorporation are kept up to date, if applicable.
- Maintain adequate insurance coverage on all properties and develop risk management policies.
- Be accountable to the charge conference and ad council.
- Submit an annual budget to the committee on finance for insurance, maintenance and improvements.

*The Parsonage Committee is responsible only for parsonage related issues, including maintenance and submitting an annual budget.

Please note. Nowhere do these responsibilities expect you to turn a screwdriver or get on a ladder.

The Chair of Trustees guides the work of the trustees, plans the agendas and presides at meetings. This person should also become knowledgeable of legal and insurance requirements. She/he keeps in close communication with the pastor and church council. There is currently no Chair of Trustees.
