

There's been a lot of talk lately about the challenges and opportunities for the United Methodist Church and the Mountain Sky Annual Conference in view of recent General Conference votes and Judicial Council rulings. I hear most of the talk within the Glendive and Wibaux United Methodist Churches is usually done by the same small groups of parishioners. Ironic how humanity is always ready to spread bad or ill-informed news, gossip even. But, when it comes to Good News, we whisper or are silent.

At the Charge Conference on October 27, both churches approved the Pastor's Compensation and a slate of church leadership nominees. The attendees listened to an uplifting message from Bishop Karen Oliveto and engaged in heartfelt discussions on the future of the United Methodist Church and Mountain Sky Annual Conference in particular. There are about 150 members between both churches (as best I can figure) and yet less than 20 attended Charge Conference to worship, share in Holy Communion and make decisions for the congregations.


