

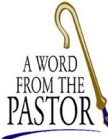

*Mark 5: 34a*



Friends, this has been a roller coaster ride for me and my

family for the past few months. We have dealt with Don's open heart surgery, cardiac rehab, and diet restriction which have led to a new way of eating. We have also dealt with my Shingles outbreak and the health issues that have come with that. We are very fortunate that our daughter Tiara could come and care for us. Things are much better now as Tiara has gone home, and Don and I are back to work.

As I think of all the changes (both temporary and permanent) that we have gone through I am glad that God has been with us. I do not believe that we would have made it without our faith in the risen Savior. I am re-

mindful of the Bible story which is told in Matthew, Mark and Luke about the woman who had been bleeding for 12 years. Mark tells it like this.

### Mark 5:24b-34a

Good News Translation

<sup>24b</sup> So many people were going along with Jesus that they were crowding him from every side.

<sup>25</sup> There was a woman who had suffered terribly from severe bleeding for twelve years, <sup>26</sup> even though she had been treated by many doctors. She had spent all her money, but instead of getting better she got worse all the time.

<sup>27</sup> She had heard about Jesus, so she came in the crowd behind him, <sup>28</sup> saying to herself, "If I just touch his clothes, I will get well."

<sup>29</sup> She touched his cloak, and her bleeding stopped at once; and she had the feeling inside herself that she was healed of her trouble. <sup>30</sup> At once Jesus knew that power had gone out of him, so he turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my clothes?"

<sup>31</sup> His disciples answered, "You see how the people are crowding you; why do you ask who touched you?"

<sup>32</sup> But Jesus kept looking around to see who had done it.

<sup>33</sup> The woman realized what had happened to her, so she came, trembling with fear, knelt at his feet, and told him the whole truth. <sup>34a</sup> Jesus said to her, "My daughter, your faith has made you well."

Even when things look grim or we are unsure of what is happening, our faith in Jesus Christ will help us to make it through those hard times in life. We will not all have the exact situations or go through the same things but there is one thing that remains with us all and that is God! God is always there for us no matter what.

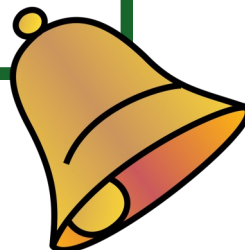

## Calling All Kids

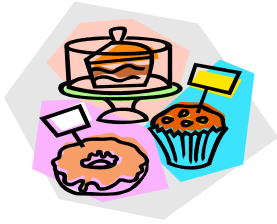
Sunday School meets at a new time this year and is open to children ages 4-10.

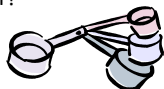

4. Squash selfishness.

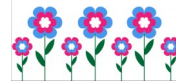
Plant four rows of lettuce:
