

## Baking for All!

#### Mississippi Mud Cake

by Erlys Neard

- 2- sticks of oleo
- 1/2 cup cocoa
- 2 cups sugar
- 4 eggs (slightly beaten)
- 1 1/2 cups flour
- Pinch of salt
- 1 1/2 cups chopped nuts
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Melt oleo and add cocoa to it, remove from heat and stir in sugar& eggs, mix well, add flour, salt, nuts, and vanilla.

Mix well, pour in cake pan 13x9x2 & bake for 35-45 minutes at 350. Place small marshmallows on top of cake and melt them.

#### Chocolate Chip Frosting

Bring 2 cups of sugar, 1/2 cups oleo, 1/2 cup milk to a bubbly boil. Add 1 cup chocolate chips. Beat will and spread on layers. This makes a generous amount of frosting. Walnuts may be added in a 9x12 loaf cake. Then spread the frosting over the marshmallows.






- Children's Sunday School will start.
