UMC Polity and History

Paragraph 340, 2016 Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church

The responsibilities of a pastor are four-fold: ministry of Word, ministry of Sacrament, ministry of Order and ministry of Service.

- 2a) Word and ecclesial acts:
- (1) Preach the word of God, lead in worship, and teach the Scriptures, and engage the people in study and witness.
- (2) To counsel persons with personal, ethical, or spiritual struggles.
- (3) To perform the ecclesial acts of marriage and burial.



- (4) To visit in the homes of the church and the community, especially among the sick, aged, imprisoned, and others in need.
- (5) To maintain all confidences, inviolate...... except in cases of child abuse or where mandatory reporting is required by law.

2b) Sacrament:

- (1) Administer the sacraments of the baptism and the Supper of the Lord.
- use of other means of grace.

2c) Order:

- (1) To be the administrative officer of the local church and to assure that the organizational concerns of the congregation are adequately October provided for.
- (2) To administer the temporal affairs of the church at their appointment, the annual conference and the general Church.
- (3) To participate in denominational and conference programs and training opportunities.
- (4) To lead the congregation in racial and ethnic inclusiveness.

2d) Service:

- (1) To embody the teachings of Jesus in servant ministry and servant leadership.
- (2) To give diligent pastoral leadership in order- Community News ing the life of the congregation for discipleship in the world.
- (3) To build the body of Christ as a caring and giving community, extending the ministry of Christ to the world.
- interreligious concerns and encourage the people to become so involved and to pray and labor for the unity of the Christian community.
